- **4. CHAIR & COUNCILS COMMENTS**: The chairman informed council that Mr Fernihough has kindly refurbished the road sign free of charge. The clerk was asked to send a letter of thanks. Also a letter to Pat Townsend for organising another successful litter pick.
- **5. CLERK'S REPORT & CORRESPONDENCE:** The clerk gave an update on the Data Protection Bill which comes into force in May. - **9. UPDATE & DISCUSSION PROVISION OF BROADBAND IN THE PARISH:** Update from Steve Brookes: BT are currently modelling West Lindsey in terms of eligible premises ie not currently upgraded to faster broadband. Output from this exercise is expected during April and assuming there are no real issues, LCC will approve the model and this will become the deployment plan. Invitations to be extended to Cllr Richard Davies, Steve Brookes and Richard Wyatt to next meeting.
- **10. TO DISCUSS PUBLIC RIGHTS OF WAY IN THE PARISH**: Concern was raised regarding dangerous state of the BOAT and footpath linking Moor Road to the Viking Way. This is due to the illegal off roading by 4x4 vehicles and quad bikes. The clerk has made both the police and LCC Footpaths officer aware. Clerk to raise again.
